Please clean up after your dog using the bags and bins provided.

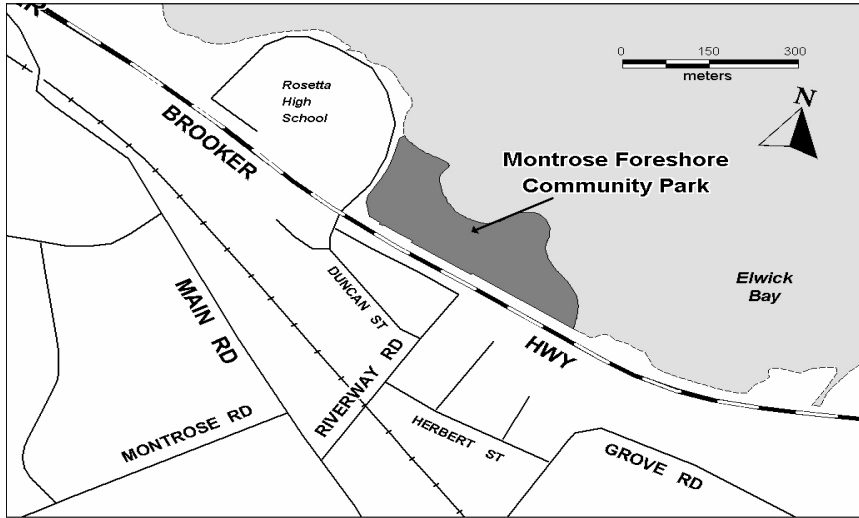

An owner is held responsible for their dog's actions and behaviour.

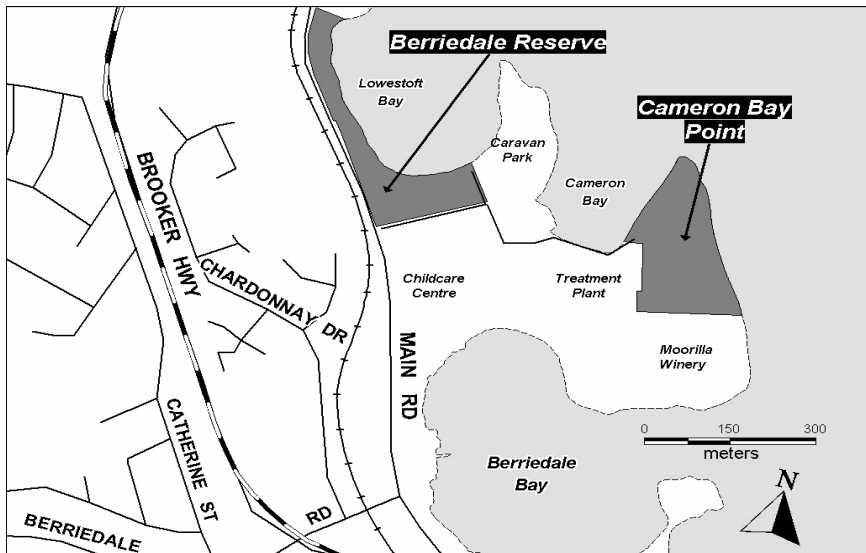
Dogs must be under effective control at all times. If you know that your dog is not immediately responsive to your commands, it would be better if the dog remains on lead while other dogs and people are around.



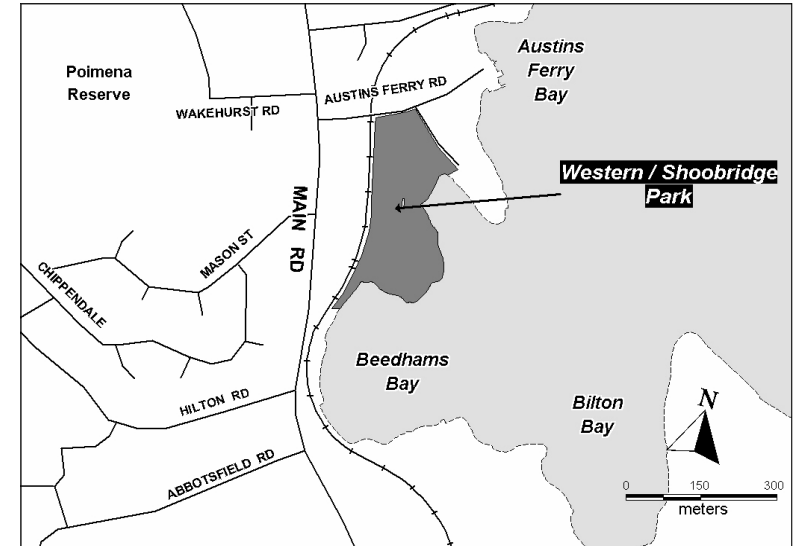
Montrose Foreshore Community Park
(right hand side of the car park)



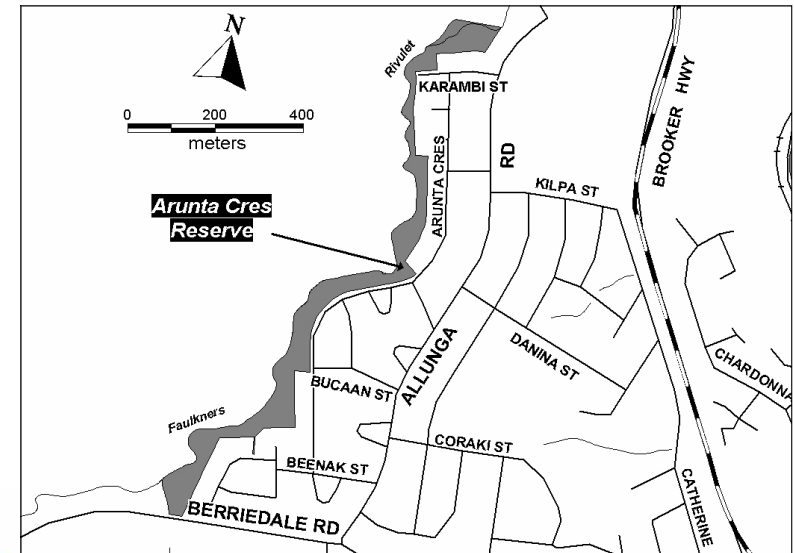
Berriedale Reserve (left hand side of the car park)

Dog Exercise Areas in Montrose and Berriedale

Chigwell, Claremont and Austins Ferry

School grounds, sportsgrounds, swimming pools, children's playgrounds, parks, shops, shopping complexes or natural area reserves are out of bounds for dogs. These are restricted/prohibited areas under the Dog Control Act 2000 and penalties apply if animals are taken into these areas.

Glenorchy City Council encourages dog owners to use these designated off-lead areas to exercise and socialise their dogs.
