A new planning scheme for Glenorchy

The Tasmanian Planning Scheme -**Glenorchy** has been approved to replace the Glenorchy Interim Planning Scheme 2015. The new scheme is online at iplan.tas.gov.au.

The new scheme introduces a single set of planning rules that apply consistently across Tasmania through the Tasmanian Planning Scheme. Achieving State-wide consistency in planning schemes is a key policy of the Tasmanian Government.

The Tasmanian Planning Scheme -**Glenorchy** comprises zone and overlay maps and locally unique planning rules. This local content protects our heritage and environment and includes specific rules for special areas such as

Glenorchy CBD, Claremont and Wilkinsons Point.

The new scheme has been written based on the former scheme, but using the new template of zones and

planning rules set by the Tasmanian Planning Scheme.

With the new scheme in place, strategic citywide projects, such as the Greater Glenorchy Plan can develop and flourish. Council is focused on supporting the need for greater housing diversity and density along the Northern Suburbs Transit Corridor. The new Planning scheme supports a consistent approach to development for our state and our local areas.

Glenorchy Jobs Hub – Matching Local People with Local Jobs

The Glenorchy Jobs Hub is a free service to help people in our city to connect with Glenorchy businesses and boost our local job economy.

The Hub, based at St Matthews Church in the heart of the Glenorchy CBD, is open for anyone seeking help and advice to find work. Onsite job coaches specialise in key employment areas in our City and will work one-onone to help jobseekers get job ready and match them with suitable employment opportunities.

The Hub also works closely with Glenorchy employers to make meaningful, lasting connections with future workers, training and support. Three local businesses have already signed up for a Glenorchy Jobs Pledge to support our community to access key training, work experience, placements and employment.

The Glenorchy Jobs Hub has free online resources to book an appointment with a Jobs Coach, post a job advertisement, search jobs in Glenorchy or see what training is on offer to refine or re-direct your skills.

The Glenorchy Jobs Hub is a Glenorchy City Council initiative working in partnership with STEPS and supported by the Tasmanian Government.

Upcoming Works and Waste Update



NO TRUCKS OVER FIVE-TONNE (5T) BRENT STREET, GLENORCHY

Due to the poor condition of a retaining wall in Brent Street new signage preventing trucks over five tonne has been put in place to prevent further damage.

Under Section 41 of the *Local Government (Highways) Act 1982*, Brent Street between Chapel Street and Lonergan Street in Glenorchy will have a 'No Trucks Over 5t' sign imposed as per Tasmania Road Rules 104.

NO SPRAY REGISTER

Glenorchy residents can now opt to join the Council's No Spray Register and have the public areas close to their property excluded from the city's ongoing weed maintenance program. Residents can submit their property address along with a plan for how they will manage the maintenance of the areas adjacent to their properties. Successful registration will be valid for two years with residents required to submit a renewal if they wish to continue on the register.

PLAYSPACES AFFECTED BY THE PANDEMIC

At its August meeting, Council voted to seek a change in the Federal funding agreement for the planned regional playspaces at Montrose Foreshore and Giblins Reserve, Goodwood. Due to a shortage of contractors, materials and labour caused by the COVID-19 stimulus, and other unforeseen costs, Council will request permission from the Australian Government to invest all the grant funds in a single Play Space at Giblins Reserve, rather than two smaller Play Spaces. FREE WASTE WEEKEND FOR GLENORCHY RESIDENTS

We're offering all Glenorchy residents FREE ENTRY to the Jackson Street Waste Management Centre in October (keep an eye on our socials and our website for final dates!).

To verify you are a Glenorchy resident and gain free entry, just show your driver's licence to the tollbooth operator. Only domestic quantities of waste will be accepted, such as a standard ute load or box trailer. Free entry does not apply to waste such as tyres, paints, chemicals, mattresses, asbestos or other hazardous waste. We'll be sharing information on the GCC Facebook page and the Council website **gcc.tas.gov.au**.

Did you know, all year round, you can also drop off recyclables at the Jackson St Recycling Centre located before the tollbooth entrance (on the left). Unwanted but good condition items can be dropped at the Recovery Shop (on the right). Check first what items are accepted on our interactive waste map **wastestartswithu.com.au/ waste-map** or contact the Waste team at Council.
