# A message from Mayor Bec Thomas

Happy New Year everyone! I hope you've had a great start to 2022 and are keeping safe and well as this wave of COVID passes through. As the clock struck midnight, and we said goodbye to 2021, I was not only reminiscing of the achievements of the year gone, but celebrating the new year and what it will bring. Looking forward to the year ahead, I am feeling incredibly motivated and committed to delivering for you in 2022.

January marks the halfway point in our current Council budget and, as a Council, we start to consider our goals and focus for next year's budget (2022-23). While we can crunch the numbers and propose options, first and foremost, we want to hear from you, our community, about what your budget priorities are. This two-way conversation between Council and the Glenorchy community will help inform not only our next budget, but future budgets. I cannot emphasise enough how important it is to have your saythis is your money, your city and your investment.

Just like a family managing their finances, we are trying to meet the expectations of the many people in our household (48 thousand residents in our case!) against a budget that only stretches so far. Like many Councils, right now we have limited resources to deliver on our priorities and community expectations. We're also still feeling the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, with a budget deficit forecast for this year.

Although we have limited ability to fund new projects in 2022-23, we can prioritise our works and existing budgets to best meet community expectations.

My priority over the next few months is to listen to our community so we can inform the decisions we make about where we should allocate our funds when we are developing our 2022-23 budget. We'll consult with the community using various means to make sure everyone can have their say.

Like any other, this year will come with its own unique challenges, but the potential we have to sustainably and safely grow our City will far outweigh these in the years to come, and regardless, we're made of tougher stuff here in Glenorchy, I know we are up for everything that comes our way.

# **2022 Community Award Winners**

We received many worthy nominations in the lead up to the 2022 Community Awards. Glenorchy spirit is strong across the six award categories demonstrating the achievements and dedication of many amazing people in Glenorchy.

#### CITIZEN OF THE YEAR 2022 -WINNER: ERIC MYERS

Eric has a history of volunteering going back to the 1980's. More recently Eric has been involved with Claremont Rotary as board member, Secretary and Treasurer as well as an exchange host and mentor for young people. Eric was the instigator and coordinator organising the interactive 'Walk of Remembrance' in Claremont, which details the history of the WWI army camp located there. A recent ongoing project is Eric's involvement with TadTas, a not-for-profit organisation that helps modify equipment used by people with disabilities to suit their individual needs.

#### YOUNG CITIZEN OF THE YEAR 2022 - WINNER: ELI MORRISON

Eli has been a Student Leader at Guilford Young College. Prior to this as a Year 11 student, Eli was actively involved in the Glenorchy Campus Just Act Student Committee raising awareness of issues within the College and wider community of justice, and aims to build a positive community spirit. He has made a great contribution to the wellbeing of our community and represents the wider Glenorchy community as a fine young person with much to contribute to society.

#### SPORTS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD 2022 - WINNER: JOHN CLARKE AND JUDY LATHAM -GLENORCHY RODMAN BOWLS CLUB

John and Judy were appointed as joint bar managers about three years ago.

Any day of the week you can find them both at the Club first thing of a morning and often the last pair to leave of a night. Among many tasks, they cook the BBQs, clean, organise and collect entry fees for social bowls, all while refusing to accept any payment for their hard work. The Club cannot express how grateful they are for all that John and Judy do to make life enjoyable for all who attend this great Club.

#### ALL ABILITIES AWARD 2022 -WINNER: LUKE RAND

Luke's different abilities meant that he was unable to hold down a part time job like other teenagers. Undeterred, in year 10, he set up his own business and created his own job. Fast forward a few years, Luke's business 'Who Gives a Crap – Ramp up' is growing, now employing a warehouse coordinator to help him distribute eco friendly toilet paper products.

With a great sense of humour and fun, Luke also generously gives back to his community. He has donated over \$1,000 to Sleep Out for the Salvos, he participates in the Council's International Day for People with a Disability, and Beyond the Classroom presentations with the Salvation Army. Luke donates toilet paper from time to time to those in need.

#### COMMUNITY GROUP OF THE YEAR 2022 - WINNER: LIONS CLUB OF GLENORCHY CITY

The Glenorchy Lions Club work hard and have a strong community spirit,

taking an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of our community. The Glenorchy Lions provide an outlet for individuals to meet new people, take interest in issues of concern to the community and help out people in need. The Lions Club of Glenorchy City has responded to the ongoing pandemic and adapted their services to provide for those in our community most in need. Located in Berriedale, the Club has established a community drop-in space accessible for the greater community.

### SCHOOL GROUP OF THE YEAR 2022 – JOINT WINNERS: SRC AT SPRINGFIELD GARDENS PRIMARY AND ROSETTA PRIMARY E-TEAM.

Student Representative Council -Springfield Gardens Primary – The SRC have been instrumental in all areas of planning and implementing a Bush Food Garden within the school grounds. The SRC identified the need for a space within our school to celebrate Aboriginal culture and highlight the importance of Tasmanian native plants in Aboriginal culture.

Rosetta Primary E-Team - The School E-team group is a significant part of the culture of the school and consistently models good environmental practice. This group consists of students from prep- grade 6. They arrange events and highlight significant days of action like Clean up Australia Day, Earth Hour, Plastic Free Days and Tree Day.





# **100 Glenorchy jobs and counting**

Glenorchy Jobs Hub recently celebrated its first major milestone after finding work for its 100th job seeker since opening in August last year.

The Hub is a not-for-profit initiative run by Glenorchy City Council in conjunction with STEPS Group Australia – a partnership that helps connect local residents with local jobs.

The Glenorchy Jobs Hub is supported by a \$1.3 million grant from the Tasmanian Government, as part of Jobs Tasmania's Regional Jobs Hub Network.

Glenorchy resident Timothy Clark had recently been made redundant due to Target Northgate's closure, forcing several former Target employees to turn to the jobs market to find local employment. Upon signing up to the Hub Timothy was able to find work within a short window in retail giant Spotlight's new Glenorchy store. Timothy's success also marked the 100th employment success in the Jobs Hub's sixth month of operation. "It felt very stressful going into the new year not knowing what the job prospects would be like for me with our store closure. But it (joining the Hub) was one of the best decisions I could've made as it facilitated me finding employment," Timothy said.

Clients are also given the opportunity to undertake professional training and development, equipping them with the skills needed to succeed at work. Unlike traditional job services, the Hub aims to create a personal connection and tailored approach with its clients.

Local employers across a range of industries are also benefitting from the service. Many have signed a Jobs pledge with the Hub, committing to work closely with the Jobs Hub on finding the right employee for their business.

# New Bridgewater Bridge to provide **Glenorchy** jobs boost

In December, the Tasmanian Government announced that McConnell Dowell had been selected as the contractor to build the new Bridgewater Bridge.

The bridge, which is a major entry point to Glenorchy City, is estimated to cost \$786m, with construction due to commence in mid-2022.

McConnell Dowell's design is for a new, four lane bridge with upgraded interchanges at Granton and Bridgewater, a safe shared pathway for cyclists and pedestrians and a navigation height matching the Bowen Bridge.

The project is expected generate 200 direct jobs over its 4-year life span, and a total of 800 direct and indirect jobs.

McConnell Dowell's appointment is already proving positive signs, with local company VEC Civil Engineering engaged to work on the project.

Daniel Longey, VEC's Manager Structures, was enthusiastic about the potential for the project to create jobs in Glenorchy.

"There is significant opportunity for the involvement of local construction expertise, Tasmanian suppliers and local job creation." Mr Longey said.

"We are excited about the opportunity the project presents for job seekers in the Glenorchy municipality."

The new Bridgewater Bridge is the largest transport infrastructure project ever undertaken in Tasmania.
