
Moonah Taste of the World Review Survey



Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan

Council is committed to strengthening our relationships and working partnerships with the local Aboriginal community, so that we better understand, value and share the stories and aspirations of Aboriginal people.

To achieve this, Council is developing a Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), which will guide our reconciliation efforts as an organisation. This work will be guided by the 5 dimensions of reconciliation:

- 1. Race relations How to build positive two-way relationships
- 2. Equality and equity How can we close the gap between Aboriginal people and non-Aboriginal people (eg health, work, life expectancy, culture)
- 3. Institutional integrity Use RAP to have our organisation support equality for Aboriginal people
- 4. Unity How to value and recognise Aboriginal culture and heritage as a proud part of a shared national identity
- 5. Historical acceptance How to create understanding and acceptance of the wrongs of the past and their impact on Aboriginal people amongst all Australians. And that these wrongs will never be repeated.
