

# 2023 CHILD & YOUTH SAFETY SURVEY

## WHAT DO YOUNG PEOPLE SAY

### WHO DID WE TALK TO?

25.9% of people (46 people) who completed the Child and Youth Safety Survey in November 2023 were aged 19 years or under.

Surveys were collected online or through outreach at Youth Beat, MRC Tas Youth Drop-In, Northgate or Claremont Plaza.



### WHO HELPS

The survey found low community awareness of services working with young people in the Glenorchy City Area.

People want more services and activities for young people in our community.

People said that public spaces, youth outreach, a youth space and youth programs are important to support children & young people.



### BARRIERS

Young people identified institutional barriers and their own mental health as the biggest barriers to achieving their goals.

Institutional barriers include financial barriers, transport, being suspended or expelled from school, disability, feeling powerless, lack of family support or feeling targeted by authorities.
