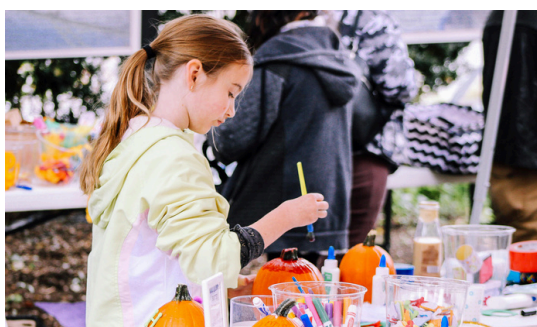

Program Spotlight

Full Gear Motorcycle Safety Program
Full Gear is a program for young people who want to obtain their motorcycle L's (Learner's motorcycle license), have barriers to completing the course and may benefit from support. At the end of the course, participants are legally able to ride. We take applications from young people who have participated in or are at risk of unsafe road/motorcycle use. Participants must be 16 years and 9 months old and have completed a Motorcycle Road Rules Knowledge Test at Service Tasmania. [Find out more here!](#)

The CommUNITY Hub is now open!

We have launched the CommUNITY Hub in the old Labour Bureau, also known as the library or pensioners building.

The hub will serve as a welcoming environment for activities, support programs, and social connections. Designed to bring people together, the hub offers a range of services, programs and facilities, including a meeting room, co-working space, and a small kitchen.

The new hub supports residents by offering access to important resources, including employment assistance, health and well-being programs, and support for local businesses. There are also programs for all ages, such as workshops, classes, and arts activities.
